## Masha Arsenieva.

### RUSSIAN DANCER TO GIVE RECITAL IN CITY HALL.

Masha Arsenieva, the Russian plastic and impressionistic dancer, is to complete her successful South African tour with a recital in the City Hall, Cape Town, on 17th December.

Masha Arsenieva was born in Leningrad but spent most of her life in Belgrade, where she studied dancing under Elena Poliskova, noted Russian dancer and teacher. She completed her training under Olga Preobragenska, another famous ballet dancer of the Russian Ballet. In 1932 she entered the ballet of the Royal Opera House, Belgrade, where she became the Prima Ballerina, and she has danced in the leading capitals of Europe with great success.

When the Dalmatian Coast was invaded, she tried to escape in her own yacht, and, when the yacht was confiscated, left in a small sailing boat with a naval officer and was at sea for many days. She was arrested on reaching the Italian Coast and was put in a cell with 14 other political prisoners. She scrubbed out cells and trains, slept on straw and could not change her clothing for three months. She escaped and was in hiding for three months. Later she joined the British Army Welfare Services and danced for the troops in Italy and Austria.

Arsenieva will present dances that have not been seen here before. She is an exponent of the modern Plastic Dance, from her association with Mary Wigman, one of the leading teachers of modern dancing. She has also composed choreographies for the Royal Opera Houses of Belgrade and Bucharest.

One of the important factors in the dancing of Masha Arsenieva is the fact that she does not adhere solely to classical ballet. Her conceptions of the dance are those of a realist.

Her husband, Boris Igneff, the Russian pianist and ballet composer, is accompanying her as musical director. Igneff, after the liberation of Rome, joined the British Army and fought in the remainder of the Italian campaign, in which he was wounded. He thereafter joined the British Welfare Services and worked together with his wife. Igneff has written some very interesting and original music for the Ballet, and the combined work of Arsenieva and Igneff results in a most colourful and original presentation.
