The Grand President and Officers of the Grand Executive in Johannesburg conducted the Installation Ceremony, at which Wor. Bro. Gus Haberfeld was installed as President, Wor. Bro. M. Frank as Vice-President, Bros. Joe Brenner, Treasurer, Cyril Haberfeld, Master of Ceremonies, and Sol Zev as Secretary.

In the evening a distinguished gathering of the local Jewish community and brethren from visiting sister Lodges were entertained at a banquet held at the Savoy Hotel. The toast of the Order was ably proposed by Wor. Bro. G. ALHAMBRA.

"The Magic Bow", the British film which stars Stewart Granger, Phyllis Calvert, Jean Kent and Dennis Price, is based on the life of the famous Paganini and opens at the Alhambra Theatre on Monday.

New York.

With appropriations for April reaching 6,117,000 dollars, the Joint Distribution Committee has announced that its allocations during the first four months of 1947 totalled 29,872,000 dollars—the largest sum ever expended in any four-month period in the history of the organisation.

The announcement points out that the April appropriation will aid distressed Jews in more than 30 countries on three continents, including a special project for tubercular Jews who will be supported in sanatoria in Switzerland, Italy and other countries.
