Hans Beyth had had full opportunity to prove that he was worthy of having the fate of thousands of children and youths placed in his hands. Yet how wonderful were the years ahead, when tens of thousands might have been privileged to feel the wisdom of his guidance and the inspiration of his gentle, intelligent personality.

There was never more humble a man, yet never one who had a firmer and surer grasp of the intricacies of organising the movement which is bringing to the Holy Land and educating those young Jews who have been saved from destruction. Each child, each youth, a brand plucked from the burning—Beyth, in his quiet, smiling, efficient way, knew how to fan the spark in each child's soul and to help it on its way to becoming a cherished member of the new society in the new-old Homeland.

In all this he was the devoted disciple of Henrietta Szold. They were kindred spirits. How grateful she was that in the almost overwhelming responsibilities of her old age, she had found this young man, who shared her high ideals and who was capable of being so deeply influenced by her moral personality. She had much to teach, and he absorbed all this great tradition, until at the end of her blessed life, she knew that her work reposed in trusted hands.

What a senseless, what an agonising loss. May God forgive those who so cruelly put an end to this dear, good life.
