Bratislava.

The Association of Racial Persecutees of Bratislava has submitted a complaint to the Czechoslovak War Ministry charging that discrimination against Jews exists within the machinery set up by the Government for granting special certificates to former partisans and ex-concentration camp prisoners.

A similar charge has been raised by the Bratislava newspaper "Tribuna," which asserts that the Office of the Legions, a local department of the War Ministry, discriminates against Jews. The certificates issued by the Ministry entitle bearers to various preferences in their dealings with the Government.—J.T.A.
