The new musical comedy which was presented on Monday evening last for the first time is bright and pleasing although there is little in it to create a permanent impression or to secure a lasting effect. The plot is so slight as to be almost non-existent and, played by a less capable company, the piece might easily be wearisome. But the company responsible for its production has been carefully selected and the different actors and actresses play their parts with an ability that overcomes any of the shortcomings incidental to the piece itself. The scenery is delightful and the dressing elaborate, while the limelight gentleman is certainly entitled to no small portion of the credit which may be accorded to all those concerned in the production. Miss Billie Browne is the centre of attraction and this charming comedienne secures as great a success in "Oh, Joy" as she has in previous pieces with which she has been connected. Mr. Bert Beswick plays the comedy parts with the same inimitable good humour and contagious joyousness that usually characterises his work, while Jess Sweet is responsible for some interesting dancing. Miss Cissie Thompson looks so charming when she invades George Budd's house that there is hardly a male personage in the audience who would not wish a similar invasion—provided of course his wife was away.
