

The Capetown Orchestra.

Last Tuesday night's concert consisted entirely of compositions by the famous Russian composer Tchaikovski, and for the benefit of those of our interested readers who could not attend, we are giving the programme which was as follows:— 1. Theme, Variations and Finale from Suite in G. No. 3 2. Fantasia: "Francesca da Rimini," Op. 32. 3. Pianoforte Concerto in B. Flat minor Op. 24. 4. Symphony No. 5 in E. Minor, Op. 65

The works of this maestro are too well known to require entering upon special details, and so is the brilliant playing of the Capetown Orchestra, under the able baton of their genial conductor, Mr. Theo Wendt. But special mention should be made of the Piano Concerto in B Flat minor, which was played in brilliant style by Madame Wedlake Santanera, who is so well and favourably known to all Johannesburg concert goers, as one of our leading lady pianistes and harpists. Her brilliant technique, heightened by exceptionally fine wrist action, which is the principal cause of her delicate touch, stood her in good stead in the rendition of this difficult and complicated composition. She played the cadenzas in the first part with remarkable clearness, which also applies to the octave passages in part 3. The orchestra throughout was in close touch with the artiste, thereby creating a perfect ensemble.

To-morrow, Saturday, the usual popular concert takes place, when selections from the "Pirates of Penzance," "The Gondoliers," and "Iolanthe," with the assistance of the Johannesburg Amateur Operatic Society, will be performed and on Sunday night another classical concert will be given, on which occasion a very fine programme will be submitted.

Lat st Music.

Mr. J. H. Larway, is responsible for issuing not only a number of high class songs the majority of which are to be found in the repertoire of all the leading vocalistes of the day including Dame Clara Butt, but also several albums of songs. Dealing with the latter first, there is an album of four songs entitled "Long Time Ago Songs." The music is singularly impressive and a credit to the composer Franco Leoni. The words too are most appropriate. The other two albums in this latest list of publications are "The Enchanted Garden" and "Playtime Pieces." The former consists of six impressions and of them I prefer "The Call of the Bluebird" and the "Dance of the Living Flowers." The composer is Mr. H. Baynton-Power a member of the modern

school of musicians. Ernest Austin is the composer of the latter album which is really for children. An interesting, as well as a welcome innovation is introduced in this one as there is an explanation of each piece and this certainly assists one to appreciate music. The same gentleman has also written seven poems for the pianoforte entitled "Too Music." These I must say are most impressive and only a master mind such as that of Mr. Austin could have given such particularly good composition. Coming to the songs there are no fewer than four sung by Dame Clara Butt and are as follows, "Yonder," "The Rose Shall Bloom Again," "The Little Bird," "The Homecoming of the Unknown Warrior." The remainder in this varied yet excellent new issue are "The Street of Quiet Windows," "A Rose and A Song," "A Man's Song," "The Carolling At Toon," "Pearls," and "My Mother Had A Garden."
