Mr. and Mrs. Harry Lourie, the well-known communal workers, are sailing from Southampton on the "Carnarvon Castle" on October 11th.

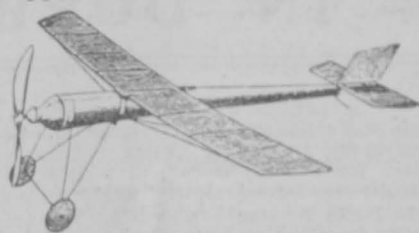
SIMCHAS TORAH DANCE.

LUNCHEON TO MISS OLGA LINDO.

Successful Jewish Guild Function.

The theatrical record made in this country by Miss Olga Lindo, the gifted English actress, was repeated at the Jewish Guild function, for this little lady attracted the largest audience in the history of the Jewish Guild luncheons. There is something about the personality of Miss Lindo, which enables her to attract hosts of admirers.

Dr. M. J. Cohen, the president of the Jewish Guild presided and a bouquet of flowers was handed to the guest by Mrs. Anita Coleman. In introducing his guest, Dr. M. Cohen expressed admiration for her work, which had lent lustre to the South African stage. He referred to the fact that Miss Lindo had been a star since 1914.

On rising to reply, Miss Lindo was given a most cordial reception and during the course of her remarks pointed out—amidst the laughter of the audience—that in 1914 she was still a little child.

Referring to her South African tour, Miss Lindo said that this has been the brightest and most successful year of her life. She would be completing her 250th performance in the country, which was in the nature of a record for a visiting artist. She expressed gratitude for the manner in which the work of her company had been supported by the members of the Jewish Guild.

Mr. Claude Saunders, who accompanied Miss Lindo, expressed appreciation for her great talent.
