

Will of the Late Mr. Jacob Senior

GENEROUS PUBLIC BEQUESTS.

£1,000 for the National Fund.

WE are now enabled to announce the particulars contained in the will of the late Mr. Jacob Senior, whose death occurred on the 11th inst., to the deep regret of his immediate family and a large circle of friends throughout the country.

The charitable disposition of the late Mr. Senior was well displayed during his lifetime when no worthy cause failed to receive his assistance. The vital interest of his life, however, was Eretz Israel, and it will be seen that he has left the magnificent sum of £1,000 to the Jewish National Fund.

All the important charitable institutions in Johannesburg in which city the late Mr. Senior spent most of his life, have been remembered by that generous-spirited individual.

The total of the late Mr. Senior's public benefactions as outlined above, amount to £3,000.

Jewish Guild Events.

A Pioneer Worker Passes.

DEATH OF MR. I. H. GUINSBERG.

The death occurred in Muizenberg on Tuesday of last week of Mr. I. H. Guinsberg, a well-known Rand pioneer, and brother of Mr. B. Guinsberg, the Johannesburg attorney and well-known congregational worker.

The late Mr. Guinsberg was one of the founders and the first President of the Pretoria Hebrew Congregation and took an active part in communal work in that town. Later he came to reside in Johannesburg and was associated with the early pioneer Jewish work here. In 1912 he retired and went to Muizenberg, where he was a prominent figure until last week when through his usual habit of bathing early at dawn, no matter in what weather, he caught a chill which proved fatal.

The funeral at Muizenberg on the following day was attended by a large concourse of mourners, whose presence was a tribute to the high esteem in which the late Mr. Guinsberg was held, and a tribute to his labour of love for a period of twenty-one years on behalf of the Muizenberg and Kalk Bay Hebrew Congregation.

The prayers at the graveside were recited by Rabbi I. M. Gervis, who also eulogised the unselfish devotion of the deceased. Cantor Katzin rendered the Haskarah.

On the way to the cemetery, the cortege had previously paused for a moment outside the recently built Talmud Torah Hall, in the erection of which the late Mr. Guinsberg had taken so prominent a part. Addresses were delivered by Rev. Frank and Rev. Isaacs.

Muizenberg Jewry mourns the loss of an energetic leader, whose place it will be almost impossible to fill.
