Mrs. J. M. PATLEY (Johannesburg).

The death occurred on Sunday in Johannesburg of Mrs. Patley, the widow of the late Mr. J. M. Patley. The deceased, who was a pioneer of the Rand, came to South Africa at the age of twelve. She was a lady of the most charitable disposition and did a great deal for various institutions during her lifetime. Her husband, who was the founder of the Universal Oil Company, died some nine years ago.

The funeral was attended by a large number of mourners.

Mrs. Patley is survived by two married daughters, Mrs. I. Jackson Lipkin (London) and Mrs. M. Jackson Lipkin (Johannesburg), and three sons, Major H. Patley and Mr. Leslie H. Patley (London) and Mr. W. Patley, who is an advocate at the Johannesburg Bar.

Third Annual Hagigat Habonim

THE third annual rally of South African Habonim will be held in Johannesburg from March 30th to April 2nd inclusive.
