

German Jews in South Africa

DOING WORK MOST USEFUL TO THE COUNTRY

THE "Star" of January 9, publishes an article by Dr. H. Mannabend dealing with the results of an investigation concerning the absorption of the refugees into the economic life of the Union.

The writer refers to the fact that commissions in Holland and Great Britain have established how the German refugees have contributed to the economic progress of these countries.

In order to find out to what extent German immigrants to South Africa play a similar role, an investigation of 1,500 immigrants resident in Johannesburg was undertaken.

It was found that not less than 25 per cent. of all gainfully occupied refugees were on their own account and have thus never entered the labour market. These immigrants have themselves provided employment for at least 600 persons, the great majority of whom are South African born.

It was also found that many of these refugees are blazing new paths in South Africa's indus-

trial development by starting new industries which were hitherto unknown. Examples are quoted.

The investigation establishes the striking fact that not less than 32 per cent. of the immigrants are craftsmen.

Surprisingly low is the number of those who are competing in the professions.

The writer also makes reference to the process of occupational retraining of these immigrants, and lastly points to the cultural contributions already made.

The whole investigation goes to prove the rapidity with which the immigrants have been absorbed into the economic life of the Union and their usefulness to the country of their adoption.

The article concludes with a quotation from Lord Cecil, who studied the situation of the German refugees in other countries: "Generosity brings its own reward."

The Late Mr. I. Oschry

The deceased will be remembered for his fine Talmudical knowledge, and for his association with traditional Judaism dating back throughout some 35 years of residency in South Africa. He was one of the protagonists of traditional Judaism here. The deceased was the first honorary secretary of the Building Fund of the Jeppestown Hebrew congregation and of the Johannesburg Talmudical College.

A keen lover of Jewish culture and a sympathetic friend to the Zionist youth movement, of which his two sons have become leading members, Mr. Oschry leaves a large number of friends both in senior and junior circles, who will sadly mourn his demise. He is survived by his two daughters and two sons, Queenie, Sybil, Sydney and Leonard.
