Today

in Jewish History

Sabbatai Zevi

TO DAY, July 23, is the birthday of Sabbatai Zevi, who was born at Smyrna on Tisha B'Ab in the year 1626 and whose career turned temporarily to the flow of Jewish history. His father belonged to the lower ranks of commerce, but as the agent of some English merchants was introduced to the Millenarian fantasies that were at the time influencing a section of English thought. The son was a mystic from childhood and as he grew up he steeped himself in the mysteries of the Cabbalah. At the age of 22, in the year 1648, foretold as that of the appearance of the Messiah, Sabbatai revealed himself to his intimate circle as that Messiah. Exiled from Smyrna for heresy, he visited various countries, including Palestine, al-ways steadfast in the belief in his mission. After some years he re-turned to Smyrna where at length he was generally accepted. His reputation spread throughout the world and he was acclaimed by Jew and Gentile as the true Mes-siah. Business was suspended on the Exchanges of Europe in preparation for the return to Zion. A great controversy arose in Jewry between his adherents and opponents in the course of which famous rabbi excommunicated famous rabbi excommunicated lamous rabbi and its reverberations continued for several generations. At length the Sultan intervened. Sabbatai was arrested and the alternatives of Islam or death placed before him. He chose the former and passed into obscurity. His cult, however, did not die with him. Many of his followers became nominal Moslems and the present-day Turkish sect of Donmeh or Hoslem-Jews, is descended from
