SUNDAY NIGHT'S MEETING CRITICISED.

The meeting held in the Zionist Hall on Sunday night in connection with the opening of the Eighteenth Zionist Congress has caused some comment among those who attended it.

A correspondent, Mr. A. Abrahamson, in a letter addressed to the "S.A. Jewish Chronicle" asks:—

"Was the meeting called for the sole pur pose of celebrating the event of the opening of the Eighteenth Zionist Congress, and, if so, why on earth was it allowed to be turned into a party propaganda meeting by the so-called "half-baked" Zionist Socialists in order to serve their ends?

"Did the Chairman approve of the soapbox oratory as well as the manner in which their speakers argued?

"Surely, on an occasion like this," says Mr. Abrabams, "when speakers of different parties should confine themselves to the task of dealing with the significance and history of Congress and dwelling on the importance of its deliberations, they should not, however large and mighty they claim to be, seize upon any one section of Zionism in order to antagonise it. On Sunday night they did this in spite of their professed desire for a united front within the Zionist ranks and all coalition talk made recently at the S.A. Zionist Congress held at Kimberley."
