**Kosher Cooking at the
Zionist Hall.**

**BETH DIN SATISFIED AS TO
FACILITIES.**

Following on a complaint received by the Dorshei Zion Association from the Beth Din in which it was alleged that the Zionist Hall was inadequately equipped for the preparation of kosher food, arrangements were made for the inspection of the kitchen of the Hall by members of the Beth Din. As a result the following letter has been received by the Hon. Secretary of the Dorshei Zion Association from the Secretary of the Beth Din.

Dear Sir,

Referring to my letter of the 6th December, 1933, subsequent to the interview with yourself, and the inspection of the kitchen in the Zionist Hall on the 14th December, I am directed to state that the information received by the Beth Din, that there are no facilities in the above-mentioned kitchen for preparing kosher food, is quite erroneous, as the installations therein are quite ample for preparing everything on a kosher basis; there are two stoves, two large tables, two zinks, two pantries, and provided proper supervision in respect of kashruth is arranged as stated in my letter of the 6th, the community will be satisfied in this matter.

**Reconstruction Cam-

Parow-Bellville.
