

Habonim Activities

Eastern Province.—The annual report on Habonim activities, received from the Eastern Province, indicates that Habonim in this Province is on a satisfactory footing. The Gedudim have worked well and consistently, and Bonim and Bonoth have taken a keen interest in the cultural work. The movement has stimulated in many of the members a true respect for the Hebrew language and a desire to acquire a mastery of it. This desire reflects itself in the fact that a number of Roshim are taking Hebrew lessons.

The two outstanding events of the year were the Bazaar and the anniversary dance. Celebrations were held in connection with the various Jewish festivals. Of outstanding interest were the Chanukah and Purim programmes. Tisha B'av and Armistice Day, the Herzl and the Trumpeldor Jahrzeit were also duly commemorated.

Western Province.—This Province is showing an ever increasing interest in the Habonim movement. New Gedudim have recently been established in Capetown and there is a demand for the formation of further Gedudim in that area.

Transvaal.—Mr. M. Donen, the organiser-secretary, has left Johannesburg this week on a tour of the Eastern Province. He is accompanied by Mr. S. Fish, of the Chalutz Farm, who will deal with matters relating to the Chalutz Farm and the conditions of entry to it.

DR. SHEIN IN PRETORIA

Addresses Women Zionists' Annual Meeting

The annual general meeting of the Pretoria Women's Zionist League was held last week in the Memorial Hall in Beatrix Street. Mrs. W. Ravid was in the chair, and there was a good attendance.

Dr. Benzion Shein addressed the gathering on "Palestine and the Jewish Woman."

Mrs. Ravid stated that the membership now stood at 300, and that the League was the most active Zionist body in Pretoria. She referred to the invaluable services given by the honorary secretary, Mrs. Schewitz, while she also thanked Mrs. P. Machanik, vice-chairman, and Mrs. Katzen, hon. treasurer for their support.

To give other causes an opportunity to raise funds, the annual Shimchas Torah Ball had not been held this year, but Mrs. Ravid said that substantial sums were raised for the Keren Hayesod campaign and the fete. The proceeds of a card evening were used to inscribe the name of the Society in the Golden Book, while the sum of approximately £180 had been forwarded to the Zionist Federation. Mrs. Ravid expressed her thanks to the Pretoria Zionist Society and the Hanoar for assistance in this direction. The sum of £50 had been collected in subscriptions, and Mrs. Balzam and Mrs. Janover were thanked for holding regular monthly meetings of the Keren Hayesod Committee.

Mrs. Katzen read the satisfactory financial report.

Mrs. W. Ravid was re-elected chairman for the third successive year. Mrs. J. Janover was elected vice-chairman. Mrs. H. Schewitz was re-elected secretary, Mrs. M.
