

# LATEST CABLES

## CURBING TERRORISM

### Energetic Measures by the Authorities

Jerusalem, Thursday.

THE police and the military are taking energetic measures to curb terrorism, and to deal with the unruly element.

A 24 hour curfew has been declared in the vicinity of the Safad district. The district is being combed for suspects and arms.

The village of Tayiba, near Tulkarm, was yesterday surrounded by police and military. Two Arabs who were arrested, attempted to escape, one of them being wounded by a rifle shot.

Thirty merchants in Acre are being held responsible, under the emergency regulations, for the recent incidents in the district.

## A MUKHTAR SHOT

### Result of His Friendship With Jews

Jerusalem, Thursday.

MEJMAN TAMIN, Mukhtar of the village of Jauneh, near Rosh Pina, was shot on Monday by a terrorist.

It is believed that the Mukhtar was shot for his friendship with the Jews.

The victim has since died in hospital.

## LAST YEAR'S RIOTS

### Proposed Scheme of Compensation

Jerusalem, Tuesday.

A TOTAL of £30,000 is to be paid to dependents of persons killed in the Palestine riots of last year as a result of ambush attacks on those injured through no fault of their own, is announced by the correspondent in Jerusalem.

Compensation will range from £250 for families whose breadwinners were killed, to £2 for people who were injured. Nobody killed or injured in the riots against the British troops or forces will be compensated.

At the same time it is officially announced that the Palestine Government will shortly examine claims for compensation to property damaged in the riots during the disturbances.

The Government has ruled that no compensation will be paid for damage to property which had been insured. It is expected that leading British insurance companies and lawyers will submit strong representations to the Government on this score, since the insurance companies have recovered considerable sums of the money paid out by the Lloyds underwriters particularly involved in these financial commitments.

F. Jardine, Chief Registrar in Palestine, will be the assessor of the payments to be made. The procedure will be announced.

## GHETTO BENCHES

### Strikes and Protests by Polish Students

Warsaw, Thursday.

THE introduction of Ghetto benches for Jewish students in the Polish Universities is creating a lot of feeling not only among the Jewish students, but also among that element in the universities which is hostile to the anti-Semitic move to mark out Jewish students for special treatment.

The Jewish students in the Warsaw High Schools have declared a two-days' strike against the Ghetto benches, while the Jewish students in those Polish universities where Ghetto benches have not yet been introduced have declared a one-day strike as a mark of their solidarity with their co-religionists.

## SERIOUS DISORDERS

Warsaw, Tuesday.

SERIOUS anti-Jewish disorders have occurred in the Suchowola district of Grodno.

Windows were smashed in the Bransk district of Bialystok, and shops were pillaged.

Scores of Jews were wounded in the rioting.

## SEQUEL TO MASSACRE

### Sentences Passed on Guilty Accused

Warsaw, Thursday.

TADEUSZ KRASINSKY has been sentenced to death for the massacre, a year ago, of five members of a Jewish family in the village of Stawy.

A second of the persons charged with the crime was sentenced to life imprisonment; a third to 15 years' imprisonment; and a fourth to 10 years' imprisonment.

The fifth accused was found not guilty, and acquitted.

## NEW COMMISSIONER FOR GALILEE

Jerusalem, Tuesday.

MR. KIRKBRIDGE, assistant British resident in Transjordan, has been appointed District Commissioner in Galilee.

## ATTACK ON GORDONIA

Jerusalem, Thursday.

GORDONIA, near Hedera, has been the scene of an attack, the bullets of the attackers entering a mess room.

There were no casualties.

## TWO MILLION DOLLARS TO BE RAISED

### After Listening to Dr. Weizmann's Radio Address

Detroit, Tuesday.

A MESSAGE from Detroit (U.S.A.), states that the National Palestine Land Redemption Conference, after hearing a radio address by Dr. Weizmann, unanimously voted two million dollars towards the purchase of land in Palestine, and also created a special emergency fund of 250,000 dollars in order to acquire "an American region" near Lake Huleh, in Upper Galilee.

In the course of his radio talk, Dr. Weizmann declared that the case for the establishment of a new Jewish State would become far stronger if more land for the Jews were purchased.

## ATTITUDE OF BRITISH LABOUR PARTY

### A Promise to Exercise Vigilance

London, Tuesday.

A PROMISE has been made by the Labour Party to watch the Palestine situation very closely, and to protect both the Arab and the Jewish interests.

This promise was made by Major Attlee, the Parliamentary leader of the Labour Party, at a discussion during the Labour Party Conference.

Mr. Tom Williams, in paying a tribute to the achievements of the Jewish people in the Holy Land, in the rebuilding of the country, declared that the Labour Party was neither pro-Jewish nor anti-Arab, but pro-Palestine.

He went on to say that the Labour Party would continue to exercise vigilance in an examination of the protests of both sides in Palestine.

Mr. Rosetti, of the Poale Zion, described to the conference the situation in Palestine, and thanked the Party for the strong stand it had made on the Palestine problem.

## STOP PRESS

### MORE OUTRAGES

AS we go to press, news has reached South Africa that further outrages occurred yesterday in Palestine. A train from Haifa to Lydda was blown up by a land mine near Kalkilieh in the evening and three passengers were killed.

A Jewish bus was ambushed near Jerusalem; an Arab passenger was killed and five Jews injured following an outburst of rifle fire. Another Arab was killed by a bomb he was preparing to throw at a Jewish bus.

## TO SPEAK FOR ARABS



Ragheb Bey Nashashibi

Jerusalem, Tuesday.

IT is learned that Ragheb Bey Nashashibi has consented to the Government's proposals to represent the cause of the Arabs in Palestine before the new Commission.

## GENERAL SMUTS MENTIONED

### To Serve on New Royal Commission

A MESSAGE sent to Johannesburg by the "Sunday Express" correspondent in Jerusalem, states that General J. C. Smuts, the Deputy Prime Minister of the Union, may be approached shortly by the British Government to serve on the new Royal Commission which is to be called on to settle the Palestine question. This information was revealed "in high official circles" in Jerusalem.

The message adds: "The Jewish community in Palestine is ready to negotiate with the Commission and the British authorities, and they have already the necessary apparatus of self-government set up and ready to take over duties. This body will be directed and supported by the Zionist Executive."

"The removal from office, and deportation, by the British of the Arab extremists in Western Palestine, and the exiling by Emir Abdullah within the last few days of Transjordan extremists, is accepted in Jerusalem as an indication that the British Government intends to remove all opposition to its partition proposal."

## HUBERMAN INJURED

Palembang, Tuesday.

HUBERMAN, the famous violinist, whose hands were injured in an air crash on October 10, has contracted pneumonia.

His medical adviser states that he will not be out of danger as long as he has pneumonia.
