JEWISH HISTORY

A Founder of the Alliance Israelite

October 15th.

NARCISSE LEVEN was born on the 15th of October, 1833. A lawyer by profession, he was for some years private secretary to the French-Jewish Minister, Adolphe Crémieux, under whom he was also Secretary-General in the Ministry of Justice during the Franco-Prussian War. With Crémieux and other prominent men he took part in the political opposition to Napoleon III. He retired with Crémieux and left politics, turning at first to the Paris Municipal Council of which he was for a time Deputy Chairman. The latter part of his life was, however, mainly devoted to Jewish public affairs. His name will always be remembered in Jewish history as a founder of the Alliance Israelite Universelle, of which he was successively secretary, vice-president and president. He was also its historian. Later he became president of the Jewish Colonisation Association to which the Alliance Israelite was closely related. This is, however, not the full tale of Leven's Jewish public work. For more than half a century he was a member of the Jewish Consistoire de Paris and for a time its vice-president. He was also a member of the Central Consistoire of France, of the Rabbinical Seminary and of the Ecole de Travail. NARCISSE LEVEN was born on
