

VISIT PALESTINE!

EXCURSIONS AGAIN ARRANGED BY ZIONIST FEDERATION

THE S.A. Zionist Federation has pleasure in announcing that it has once again arranged with the Italian Lines (now the Lloyd Triestino Co.) for excursion rates to Palestine during the early part of next year.

The rates will be on the same basis as applied to the previous excursion arrangements, with the exception of some slight modification in the quotations for the superior grades of tourist cabin accommodation. The minimum rates, however, namely £142 first class and £47 tourist class, are the same as last time, in spite of the fact that there has meanwhile been some increase in the ordinary fares.

Persons booking on the Excursion will make the forward journey to Palestine in February, March, or April, at their choice. The following are the dates of departure from Capetown:

"Duilio," February 4; "Giulio Cesare," March 11; "Duilio," April 1.

The forward journey, which terminates at Haifa, takes twenty days, passengers trans-shipping at Genoa into the large and well-appointed Lloyd-Triestino Mediterranean vessels.

Passengers can embark at any of the other coast ports instead of Capetown, the additional return charges being:

The excursion facilities are given subject to the return journey being made within twelve months.

Professor A. Z. Idelsohn Arrives in South Africa

One of the greatest authorities on Jewish music, Professor A. Z. Idelsohn, arrived in Capetown last week on the American-South African Line liner, City of New York. Until two years ago, Professor Idelsohn occupied the Chair of Jewish Music and Liturgy at the Hebrew Union College, Cincinnati, but owing to illness he was obliged to relinquish that position. As he has not been able to take his place, he is still Professor Emeritus.

Professor Idelsohn, who is accompanied by his wife and daughter, has arrived in Johannesburg to stay with relatives. On account of the serious condition of his health at the present time, he is confined to his home.
