

# Funeral of Felix M. Warburg

## Simple Ceremony Followed by Music

New York, October 22nd.

TWO thousand six hundred people were present to-day at the funeral service of Mr. Felix M. Warburg at the Temple Emanu-El and hundreds of other mourners were turned away.

The service, which lasted for 25 minutes, was a simple one. No eulogies were delivered. Rabbi Samuel Goldensen and Rabbi Emeritus Samuel Schulman officiated.

A quartet with Warburg's priceless Stradivarius played Brahms' "Romanze." The pallbearers were Mr. Warburg's four sons and Mr. George Backer, a nephew by marriage, and the nephews Erich Warburg, Walter Denerberg, John M. Schiff, and grandson, Walter Rothschild, jun.

Among the mourners in the synagogue were Governor Herbert H. Lehman, Mr. Fiorella H. La Guardia, Mayor of New York, Mr. Al Smith, Mr. J. D. Rockefeller, Mr. Percy Straus, Dr. Cyrus Adler and a large number of notable people of New York society and the world of politics, business and education. The casket with the remains of the deceased was covered with wreaths of carnations and was carried out of the temple while thousands lined the route. Police on motor cars escorted the procession to the Schiff vault in the Salem Fields cemetery in Brooklyn, where the burial took place in private.

### MEMORIAL MEETING IN LONDON

London, October 22nd.

TRIBUTES to the late Mr. Felix Warburg were paid at a memorial meeting held here to-day, which was convened by the Jewish Agency for Palestine.

Chaim Weizmann, President of Jewish Agency for Palestine, presided and speeches were made by Mr. Samuel Cohen, Professor Selig Brody, Mr. Neville Laski, President of the Jewish Board of Deputies, and Simon Marks.

### POLISH JEWRY'S TRIBUTE

Warsaw, October 22nd.

A MEMORIAL meeting for Mr. Felix M. Warburg took place here this morning. In a statement to the press, Rabbi Schorr said:

"Polish Jewry is most deeply affected by the death of Warburg. He was a man of great magnanimity and large horizons. He was the first who even in the time of war placed himself at the head of the relief campaign for the Jews of Eastern Europe. He was also very broad-minded and had a keen eye for the future needs of Jewry."

### GERMAN TRIBUTE TO WARBURG.

Berlin, October 22nd.

In a statement issued in connection with the death of the late Felix Warburg, the Hilfsverein der Juden in Deutschland, expresses deep regret at the loss of so eminent a leader.

"We mourn with the Jews of the rest of the world," the statement says. "The Hilfsverein owe the deceased their deepest gratitude for his close interest in the fate of the Jews of Germany, for his energetic support of all efforts to provide a new existence for the Jews who had emigrated from Germany." The assistance given by Mr. Warburg to the Jewish benevolent institutions in Germany as founder and President of the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee will never be forgotten.

"A great benefactor of the Jews, a noble friend of humanity, is dead. We shall keep his memory in high esteem."

### ANGLO-JEWRY'S SYMPATHY

London, October 24th.

THE Council of the Anglo-Jewish Association at its meeting here to-day, decided to send a message of "deep sympathy" to Mrs. Warburg and family on the loss they had sustained.

Mr. Leonard G. Montefiore, President, in a tribute to the late Mr. Warburg, said that suddenly one of the central figures had passed from the communal stage. "We ask," said Mr. Montefiore, "who is to take his place, who is to succeed him. I feel that Felix Warburg belonged to those very few for whom no adequate successor can be speedily found, and that is the highest tribute that can be paid."
