The death occurred recently of Mr. Harris Adler, who latterly resided in Port Elizabeth. Before coming to that centre he was for eighteen years a leading business man in Willowmore, where he was held in high esteem by all sections of the community. The deceased was a man of generous disposition and was always ready to render assistance to all who needed it.

The late Mr. Adler took a keen interest in civic affairs and was a member of the local Council for some time. He was also a keen communal worker and was President of the Willowmore Hebrew Congregation for many years. It was the late Mr. Adler who was largely responsible in effecting the building of so fine a synagogue at Willowmore. He was a keen Zionist worker and was for a period chairman of the local Zionist Society.

In the passing of Mr. Harris Adler, South African Jewry has lost a man who was a fervent adherent to orthodox Judaism and a loyal and devoted son of Israel. He is survived by a widow and five sons.
