He has achieved outstanding results in his work and has displayed exceptional ability in the realm of practical Zionist endeavour. His pleasing personality has endeared him to all those with whom he has come in contact. The good wishes of South African Zionists go with him for a pleasant and inspiring tour and a safe return to this country.

On Thursday afternoon, the 12th inst., members of the staff of the S.A.
