# Jewish State Party Holds Meeting in Pretoria

Under the auspices of the Jewish State Party, Mr. R. Laks, the vice-chairman of the Party, and Mr. D. M. Schlosberg, its honorary secretary, addressed a representative gathering of Pretoria Jewry.

Mr. Schlosberg stated that the Jewish people had fought Hitlerism for six years before the war. This struggle would go on until final victory. Because there was no Jewish army we were like unknown warriors, but we would come to the Peace Conference not on sufferance, but as of right.

The ideal of democracy was a war weapon. To many Jews, Zionism was the Jewish national form of democracy, and Zionism was, therefore, the war weapon of 15 million allies of Great Britain.

In South Africa we were becoming the spokesmen of the Jews of the Empire, and, together with the Jews of the United States, the future of World Jewry had become largely our responsibility. What was imperative was immediate unity between the Zionists of all organisations, and, thereafter to make Zionists of every Jew and Jewess. Monies collected for Zionism should be devoted in great measure to this purpose. South Africa should appoint special envoys to United States Zionism on a basis of reciprocity.

Mr. Laks said that the strategic importance of Palestine to the security of the Empire had now become apparent to the masses of Jewry. A strong Jewish State would, if it had been established, have altered the whole military situation in the Near and Middle East.

The Jews of Europe would, for a long time, be unable to return to their former economic positions. Millions would seek refuge in Palestine, which would become the Jewish State Herzl had proclaimed. In these circumstances there were no ideological differences which could divide Zionists, for the aim of Zionism to-day could only be a Jewish State in the historical frontiers of Palestine. All groups agreed on the necessity of a Jewish Army to fight as an ally of Great Britain.

Only a United Jewish Front could hope to achieve the aims all held. Here from South Africa much could be done to bring about this unity.
