Adv. H. M. Bloch, taking as his subject "New Values," set himself to answer the question whether it was quite satisfactory to continue to follow the old political objectives in Zionism, and whether it was not time to reconsider them in the light of the new circumstances which had arisen since Herzl had formulated them and which he could not have foreseen. Having briefly reviewed the position of the Jews in the world in Herzl's day, Adv. Bloch said that nowhere except in Russia and Rumania was there then an acute political Jewish problem, and even in those countries the problem was mainly social and economic. Such a relation to the Jews, as minorities, as existed in many countries to-day was quite unthinkable then, and Zionism aimed at a Homeland in Palestine for such Jews as wanted to go there, always assuming that those who chose to stay in the countries of their birth or adoption would have equal rights with all other nationals of such countries.

To-day rights of minorities did not exist any more and when the time came, as we hoped it would, for our claims to be made along with other small nations, we would have to formulate demands commensurate with the acute need of the Jewish masses, which could no longer be met by slow infiltration. We must have the room and the means for settlement on a hitherto unprecedented scale and we would have to work harder than ever before to get nearer the accomplishment of an even harder task than we had set ourselves till now.

Mrs. Segal thanked Adv. Bloch for his thought-provoking and quite unusually interesting address.

After tea Miss Lowenberg, soprano, and Mrs. Tuch, violinist, gave a delightful programme of music which was very much enjoyed and warmly applauded. Mrs. Segal thanked the artists and their accompanists on behalf of the executive and the meeting.

Scopus Club.

Mr. Miller gave a very interesting talk to a large audience on the origin of Covent Garden Opera, which was illustrated with beautiful records sung by famous artists at Covent Garden.
