Mr. Levin spoke on the position in Eretz Israel to-day and the urgent need of extending our efforts to enable the Yishub to meet wartime emergencies, to absorb the immigrants and refugees who continue to come into the country in spite of enormous difficulties, to enable Palestine to play a greater part in the war effort, and to strengthen our practical credentials when the solution of the Palestine problem will come up for decision after the war. Mr. P. Jacobson and the chairman expressed cordial thanks to the speaker for his stirring address.

After a brief halt at Heidelberg, Mr. Levin proceeded to Swellendam, where a meeting was held at the residence of Mr. and Mrs. I. Kahn. After describing the changes that the war had imposed on Palestine and how the Yishub was playing its part in helping to win the war, the speaker appealed for a greater appreciation of the fundamental problems facing the Yishub, particularly the need of greater land resources for to-day and for after the war.

COUNTRY VISITS.

Mr. S. N. Herman has undertaken a series of organisation visits on behalf of the Western Province Zionist Propaganda and Organisation Council.

Ceres.

On Wednesday, 2nd April, Mr. Herman, accompanied by the well-known Zionist worker, Mr. N. Newman, journeyed to Ceres. A well-attended meeting was held in the evening at the residence of Mr. Isaac Jacobson. Mr. Jacobson, who presided, welcomed the visitors. At the conclusion of an informative review of the latest developments in world Jewry, Mr. Herman stressed the need for all Jews to take their place in the ranks of organised Zionism.
