Dr. Anni Samuelsdorff in Johannesburg.

WIZO REPRESENTATIVE FROM PALESTINE.

Dr. Anni Samuelsdorff has arrived in Johannesburg from Palestine at the invitation of the Women's Zionist Council to give women workers in South Africa first-hand information about the work in Eretz Israel generally and the needs and achievements of the Wizo in particular.

A lawyer by profession, Dr. Samuelsdorff came to Palestine in 1935 from Germany, where she was a prominent social and Zionist worker. One of her main fields of work in Germany was the organisation of the training of young people prior to their emigration to Palestine.

She has been closely associated for fifteen years with all aspects of Wizo activity both in Central Europe and Palestine. Since settling in the latter country she has devoted herself in particular to the care of immigrant women, helping them to adapt themselves to their new conditions. Since the outbreak of war she has helped extensively in the work of providing hospitality for soldiers in Palestine, among whom she met many South Africans.

Death of Rabbi I. S. Kramer.

The death took place on Thursday night, October 1st, of Rabbi Isaac Shrage Kramer of the Ponevez Hebrew Congregation, Cape Town.

Rabbi Kramer, who was a brilliant Talmudical scholar, received his Talmudic knowledge in the Yeshivoh of Telze, Lomza and Kovna. His rabbinical degree he received from the greatest Rabbis in Lithuania. He was for some time the Rosh Haye-shivoh of Rosein Talmudical College, where he distinguished himself. On his arrival in South Africa, he became the spiritual leader of the Ponevez Hebrew Congregation where, thanks to his initiative and untiring efforts, he brought about the recognition of that Congregation.

Rabbi Kramer's funeral, which took place on Friday, Hoshano Rabo, was attended by a very large and representative number of friends and relatives. The Mita was carried by the Committee of the Ponevez Congregation to the Shul, where Psalms were read by the Chevrah Tehilim of the New Hebrew Congregation.

At the graveside Rabbi Dr. E. W. Kirzner paid high tribute to the Niftar who was an active member of the Beth Din and took part in every sphere of activities in national, educational and public matters. The Rabbi leaves a widow and two children to whom sincere sympathy is extended. May his memory be blessed.
