

Zionist Youth Activities.

Zionist Youth Executive. At an in-gathering at the Zionist Youth Office yesterday afternoon, attended by representatives of the Executive, Peninsula societies and the Hebrew Union, a farewell tribute was paid to Mr. A. Friedgood, Chairman of the Cape Town Young Zionists, who are leaving shortly on active service. Five trees are to be planted in the name of Mr. Friedgood. A tree certificate was presented to Mr. Friedgood. Earlier in the week the Cape Town Young Zionists had announced that they were presenting a tree certificate.

A number of persons who have held the office of chairman since 1938 and who have now reached twenty-five.

A very interesting and entertaining supporting programme has been arranged.
