

## Zionist Youth Activities.

An enthusiastic audience of over two hundred crowded the Minor Zionist Hall on Friday evening, 28th April, to hear Mr. Joshua Leibner at an Oneg Shabbat arranged by the Zionist Youth Executive.

In welcoming the speaker, the chairman, Mr. Egert said that as the Executive was eager to live up Zionist Youth activities in the Western Province they were very happy to have Mr. Leibner to inspire the youth to do good Zionist work.

Mr. Leibner, speaking on Chalutzit, said that it was the highest aim of Zionist Youth. He maintained that Zionist societies were for seniors. Zionist Youth should busy themselves with Chalutzit. If they made Aliyah their goal they would be good Zionists, even if they did not reach very far. He also emphasised that the leaders of Zionist Youth should come from the ranks.
