Rahbi Abrahams Addresses University

Rabbi Abrahams Addresses University Students.

Professor Rabbi I. Abrahams gave the third lecture of his series to the Jewish residents on Thursday, 14th September. His subject, by re-quest, was "The Origin of the Hebrew Scriptures." quest, was "The Origin of the Hebrew Scriptures." The lecturer described the traditional viewpoint as recorded in the Talmud, Josephus and the second Book of the Maccabees. He then explained the Higher critical standpoint and showed that, though it had thrown much light on the history and interpretation of the Bible, it was yet in many respects totally unscientific and left us with a decided debit side which was increased by the extensive popularisation that the critical theories had received. Finally, Professor Abrahams dealt with the more recent trends in biblical interpretation based on archaeological discoveries and researches into the general literature of the Orient. The lecture was followed by a most interesting discussion that ranged over many topics of both a philosophical and religious nature.
