

Prof. Goldstein Conducts C.T. Orchestra.

ELLA GOLDSTEIN AS SOLOIST.

Prof. Uriel Goldstein conducted the Cape Town Orchestra in a Tchaikowski programme on Monday night at the Colosseum which was filled to capacity, many being unable to obtain seats. Ella Goldstein was the soloist in the Concerto in B Flat Minor for piano and orchestra.

The concert opened with Symphony No. 6 in B Minor, Op. 74, "Pathétique." This work is familiar to Cape Town music lovers but Prof. Goldstein's conducting added special interest and the performance called forth much enthusiasm.

Ella Goldstein's playing of a work which calls for great technical skill left little to be desired. Her interpretation was vivid and intense and she received a tremendous ovation at the close. As encores she gave a Scriabine study and Prokofieff's "Suggestion Diabolique" played with her own individual brilliance.

As a final item the Orchestra gave a beautiful rendering of Tchaikowski's Overture, "Romeo and Juliet."

There will be a repeat performance of the Tchaikowski Piano Concerto in B Flat Minor by Ella Goldstein with the Cape Town Orchestra conducted by Prof. Goldstein at the Colosseum on Monday, 29th January, at 8 p.m. The new orchestral programme includes: Symphony No. 5 in E Minor and Symphonic Poem "Francesca da Rimini."

No sacrifice was too great and everyone should help in the task of saving human souls.

Mrs. P. M. Clouts outlined the programme of work to be undertaken and referred to the Shares Competition, the Neville Lewis Picture Competition and Savings Department of the War Appeal. She suggested that a Regional Committee be formed at Muizenberg, and it was proposed by Mrs. Edelstein, seconded by Mrs. Rifkin, that all those ladies present form a General Committee with power to add. The following Convenors were elected: Chairman, Mrs. Aaron; Treasurer, Mrs. Fine; functions, Mesdames Block and Lieb; cards, Mesdames Edelstein and Rabie; clothes, Mesdames Shaper and Singer.

Mrs. Sloman thanked Mrs. Singer very warmly for her kind hospitality.
