

## Zionist Youth Activities.

**Statement by Western Province Habonim Council.**—At a meeting of the Habonim Council on Monday, 16th April, the Council made the following statement for publication: "The Western Province Habonim Council wishes to reassert that no party politics of any form can find place in the Habonim Movement."

**Conference Oneg Shabbat.**—The Minor Zionist Hall was filled to capacity on the occasion of a pre-conference Oneg Shabbat. The guest speaker was Rabbi Israel Abrahams, Hon. President of the Cape Zionist Youth Movement, Mr. Egert who was in the chair, welcomed the speaker; Mr. J. Gelman, chairman of the Western Province Zionist Council; Mr. and Mrs. S. M. Levin, and Mr. Philip Zuckerman, Organiser-Secretary of the S.A. Zionist Youth Council. It was decided to hold the next meeting in four weeks' time at the residence of Mr. and Mrs. J. Rabinowitz. The Chairman thanked the host and hostess for their hospitality.
