Obituary.

CANTOR S. STEINBERG.

The death has occurred in Johannesburg after a prolonged illness, of one of the oldest and best known chazanim in South Africa in the person of Cantor Simchah Steinberg. For a period of 17 years, until his retirement some two years ago, was cantor of the Berea Hebrew Congregation. he

Born in Lithuania, he received his first training in "chazanoth" from the famous Cantor Rabino-witz, of Kovno, and later studied at the Odessa Conservatoire under the equally well-known Cantor Minkovsky.

After holding appointments at Dublin and Liverpool, he came to South Africa some 33 years ago as chazan of the Fox Street Beth Hamedrash. He also served with the Roeland Street Syna-gogue, Cape Town, before accepting a call from the Berea Hebrew Congregation.

He was endowed with great musical ability and about 15 years ago composed his own "Sidur," which he published in the form of a book, with a foreword by Mr. Kirby, Professor of Music at the Witwatersrand University, and the late Dr. J. L. Landau. This work was well received not only in South Africa but also abroad. About six years ago he visited Eretz Israel and had the honour of conducting services at Tel Aviv's leading synagogue.

Aviv's leading synagogue. He was a man of great erudition and culture and identified himself with every phase of Jewish life in Johannesburg. He was fond of art and possessed a fine collection of antiques. The funeral, which took place at the Brixton Cemetery, was largely attended. Cantor I. Alter conducted the service, and fitting tribute was paid to the deceased by Rabbi I. Kossowsky, Rabbi A. M. Gervis and Rev. O. Altshuler. Cantor Steinberg was predeceased by his wife in June of last year, and he is survived by a son and daughter-in-law in Johannesburg, and a daughter and son-in-law in London.
