Obituary.

Mrs. MUSHA SADUR.

The death took place on the 24th August of Mrs. M. Sadur, widow of the late Mr. Mendel Sadur.

Mrs. Sadur arrived in this country from Lithuania about 25 years ago to join her late husband, who was one of the staunchest and most orthodox members of the Jewish Community here and a very learned Talmudist. Mrs. Sadur was a very pious woman and did an enormous amount of unostentatious charitable work for local institutions. She was particularly interested in Eretz Israel where she spent about four years recently, and she had been connected there with all charitable efforts and also was a generous supporter of the Yeshivas. She was preparing just before her death to go back to Eretz Israel.

The funeral took place on Sunday afternoon and was attended by a large number of people. Rabbi M. Ch. Mirvish delivered a hesped. She is deeply mourned by her two sons, daughters-in-law, grandchildren and a large circle of friends.

Mrs. HETTY LIPSCHITZ.

The death took place on Wednesday of Mrs. Hetty Lipschitz, wife of Mr. Monte Lipschitz and daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Abraham Jacobs.

The late Mrs. Lipschitz was a woman of fine personality and was held in high esteem by all with whom she came into contact. She did a great deal of war work and was connected with various women's organisations.

Mrs. HANNAH BERNSTEIN.

The death took place in the Cape Jewish Aged Home on Monday evening of Mrs. Hannah Bernstein, at the age of 103.

Mrs. Bernstein was born in 1843 in what is now Poland and came as a young woman to South Africa, where she met her husband. She was so accustomed to using Afrikaans that she used it almost exclusively at the Home, where she was known as "Ouma." She had lived at Paarl for 50 years.

She leaves a daughter, two grandsons and a granddaughter.
