## Paul Loyonnet.

Paul Loyonnet, the distinguished French pianist,  
 scored another great success last Saturday night  
 at the City Hall when he played two concertos  
 with the Cape Town Orchestra, conducted by  
 Geoffrey Miller. In his playing of the Beethoven  
 C minor Concerto Loyonnet revealed deep feeling  
 and understanding and left a profound impres-  
 sion. His performance of the lighter Saint Saens  
 G minor Concerto was exhilarating, and he brought  
 out the beauties of this delightful work in a most  
 satisfying manner. Loyonnet is a pianist of  
 strong individuality and masterly technique. He  
 received a tremendous ovation on Saturday night,  
 which he shared with the Orchestra, who were in  
 excellent form. As encores he played Saint Saens  
 Gavotte for left hand and Chopin's A flat Polo-  
 naise.

Loyonnet will give another recital to-night  
 (Friday) at the City Hall. His programme in-  
 cludes Beethoven, Bach, Chopin, Schubert, Schu-  
 mann, Debussy, Liszt and others.

Study these rules:—

1. Buy only as much bread as you need.
2. Remember that it is wrong—and unfair to yourself—to sift meal.
3. Don't cut off crusts.
4. Don't feed bread to animals.
5. Don't slice bread up before a meal. Cut each slice from the loaf as it is needed.
6. Cut thinner slices.
7. Keep bread fresh, so that each loaf lasts as long as possible.
8. Don't use fresh bread for making puddings or other dishes.
