Rome.

Displaced Jews in the Fasoli camp, near Modena, completed a five-day hunger strike which they proclaimed in protest against the poor treatment which they received at the camp.

The Italian Government indicated that it would be ready to release the Jews from the camp provided they agree to be repatriated in groups of five to Poland. The Jewish D.P.'s refused this offer.

Paris.

The first group of 62 Jewish orphans from Ose homes in France have sailed for the United States, the offices of the organisation here announced. The children are going to relatives. Their passage was financed by the Joint Distribution Committee and the Hias. Although none of them is over 18 years of age, most were in Nazi concentration camps and narrowly escaped being deported with their parents to death camps in Poland.

Munich.

According to an Unrra announcement, quoted by Munich radio, Czechoslovakia plans to expel between 2,000 and 3,000 German Jews from the Sudetenland. Preparations are being made by Unrra to receive the expelled persons.

Dr. Bronislaw Fryling. Zionist Youth Activities.

Dr. Bronislaw Fryling, the eminent violinist, who will give a concert with the Cape Town Orchestra on Saturday, 28th September, and a solo recital in the City Hall on Tuesday, 1st October, has been justly acclaimed for his brilliant technique and interpretive powers. Cape Town music lovers certainly have a treat in store for them.

In his forthcoming concerts Fryling will use his celebrated Stradivarius. His programmes will include the Kreutzer Sonata, the Cesar Franck Sonata, and a first performance of Gagliano's Summer Phantasia. The last mentioned will be a first World Performance.

Dr. Fryling, besides his musical accomplishments, is a sportsman with a wide range of activities. As a racing driver Dr. Fryling has won the "Bugatti Grand Prix", the Polish Tourist Competition on a "Steyr", and one of smaller tourist competitions on a Studebaker Commander 1929 Model. He raced with Caraciola and Hans von Stuck, two of the foremost motorists in Europe. In 1924 he was champion; motor car racing and in 1928 holder of the Polish Speed record. Dr. Fryling is also a big game hunter and photographer. He prefers photography to shooting. He only shoots when in danger or for food if on long safaris. Dr. Fryling is certainly a man of many parts. Cape Town looks forward to this distinguished musician and versatile sportsman.
