Fryling Concert on Saturday Night.

Dr. Bronislaw Fryling, the eminent Polish violinist, will give a concert with the Cape Town Orchestra at the City Hall on Saturday night, 28th

inst., and a solo recital on Tuesday, 1st October.

Dr. Fryling comes of a musical family, his cousin being Vladimir Horowitz. He recently completed a book called "A Basic Thesis on Violin Playing," which represents a new method of teaching.

Whereever he has played Dr. Fryling has immediately been recognised as a virtuoso of the first order.

Dr. Fryling has brought with him a Stradivarius violin dating back to 1719 and valued at £10,000. He found this instrument in a famous English collection, and he will use it for the first time on a public platform in

Cape Town.

Being a top-ranking violinist, who started playing as a child of eight, by started playing as a child of eight, by no means sums up the achievements of Dr. Fryling. To his doctorate of music he added a doctorate in law, and was for some time professor of penal law at the University of Cracow, his home town. He is the author of several books on musical education.

On Saturday night Dr. Fryling will play two concertos: The Mendelssohn Concerto and the Mozart Concerto in A. Major No. 5. On Tuesday night he will play the famous Cesar Franck Sonata and Jewish compositions.

IMPRESSIVE END-OF-YEAR MINYAN

The final Sabbath eve of the Jewish year was the occasion of a special service organised by the teachers and pupils of the United Hebrew Schools, Cape Town. There was a full attendance of the children, and amongst the ance of the children, and amongst the distinguished guests present were the Mayor and Mayoress of Cape Town, Councillor A. Bloomberg, M.P., and Mrs. Bloomberg, and Professor Rabbi Israel Abrahams. It was truly a festive excession. Israel Abrahams. It was truly a festive occasion. In large neat Hebrew characters notices conveyed the traditional New Year greeting and the quotation: "May the Old Year pass with its curses, may the New Year enter with its blessings." The scarlet robes of office of the Mayor helped to provide a colourful scene, and the film of the earlier proceedings, taken by Mr. I. Sachar, should serve as a memorable record of a notable event.

The proceedings were conducted in their entirety by the children themselves. The young men began by leading the Minchah service. There followed the lighting of the Sabbath candles, preceded by the symbolic dropping of a coin in the Keren Kayedropping of a coin in the Keren Kayemeth box, with the Brocha confidently recited by the young lady selected for this honoured task. Thereafter three other girl pupils read suitable items in Hebrew and English on the themes of Sabbath and of Eretz Israel. After a change of "chazan" (without affecting the smooth and confident flow of the service) the Sabbath evening the service) the Sabbath evening prayers were ushered in. After the "Lecha dodi" Rabbi Abrahams ad-dressed the children in simple but impressive tones. He told them of their duties to themselves, their parents and families, their teachers and their studies, and of their part in Jewish life and the rebuilding of Eretz Israel. He dealt with the teachings of Judaism on the question of citizenship, and in this connection paid a warm tribute

to the Mayor and Mayoress, stressing that the honour that had been conferred upon them by the City reflected

upon the children and all Jewry.

Readings in Hebrew and English from the Tanach were then given by two other pupils, and thereafter the Maariv service proceeded. Kiddush was recited by a diminutive but completely unselfconscious young lad. It was extremely reassuring to notice how the entire juvenile congregation joined in hearty singing of the various portions of the service and followed with a complete knowledge and understanding of what was going on. One gained the impression that participation in regular Friday evening services gave the children a real "oneg Shab-bat," and for this fine achievement warm praise is due to the principal, Mr. Z. Avin, and the willing members of his staff.
