

Zionist Youth Activities.

Third Annual United Zionist Party Youth Conference.

The third annual United Zionist Party Youth Conference was held at the Zionist Hall, on Saturday and Sunday, 22nd and 23rd March.

Mr. S. M. Levin presided. Conference commenced with an official opening and an address by Professor Rabbi Israel Abrahams. The Rabbi referred to the recent World Zionist Congress, where the confederation of General Zionists had made marked steps towards unity and in spite of rumours to the contrary, were able to present a united front. He analysed the present political situation and dealt with many internal issues of the U.Z.P. British policy in Palestine had become clarified as neither pro-Jewish nor pro-Arab, but pro-British. The Rabbi condemned acts of terror by certain dissident groups in the Yishuv and expressed the hope that the youth would realise the futility of such activity.

Greetings were delivered by Mr. M. Bobrov on behalf of the Senior United Zionist Party; by Mr. Dov Senderowitz on behalf of the official Youth Executive and by Mr. A. Miller on behalf of the Cape Zionist Youth Executive.

The political debate opened with the re-affirmation of the U.Z.P. aims by Mr. D. Senderowitz. He emphasized the importance of Chalutzit and made an appeal for a more active support of Hachshara by Cape members of the Chalutz Group. The resolutions dealing with undisciplined violence in Eretz Israel, evoked a lengthy discussion in which many delegates participated. A strongly worded resolution condemning the activities of the Irgun Zvai Leumi and the Stern groups was passed by an overwhelming majority.

Sunday's session opened with a report by the Chairman, Mr. Colin Traub. This was followed by sessions dealing with organisation, culture and education, Chalutzit, Bnei Zion, and general. Discussion was throughout on a very high level, and particularly in the debate on chalutzit, in the course of which members of Chalutz groups took a leading role. All resolutions dealing with chalutzit were passed unanimously. Mr. D. Senderowitz who himself is on Hachsharah warned the delegates of the tendency to pass Chalutz resolutions unanimously without consideration of the practical issues involved. He urged all delegates to re-consider their attitudes towards Chalutzit and trusted that as a result of the debate the Chalutz section would be considerably increased. Conference was attended by two other members from U.Z.P. Hachshara, Messrs. H. Berelowitz and Alf Levi. During the official luncheon tribute was paid to the outgoing chairman, Mr. Colin Traub. An announcement that five trees would be planted in his name, was greeted with applause. Mr. I. Sachar was presented with a gift in appreciation of his services, especially in gratitude for his successful organisation of the Purim concert.

Prior to her successful singing career she spent several years studying in Milan, Paris, Brussels and England under great masters.

Oversea singing professors and critics were all amazed at her phenomenal range and her remarkable abilities as a singer.

She had the good fortune to become an honorary pupil of the late Baroness Madame Blanche Marchesi, world-famous singing teacher.

Miss Herison has performed in some of the largest music halls and theatres and at great Victory celebrations with many of the best-known symphony orchestras in England, and has also toured throughout its length and breadth with Entertainment National Service Association companies.

Just before leaving England she had a successful audition at the Royal Opera House, Covent Gardens, but as the next operatic season starts only next year, she chose to come back to South Africa to visit her father, brothers, relatives and many friends.
