

A new Jewish settlement was established in the Negev overnight. Squads of Haganah men set out on Monday night of last week to the site of the new settlement, situated less than a mile from the Arab village of Bureir, which has been the main threat to Jewish communications in the Negev during the past four months. For ten hours members of the kibbutz worked unceasingly under a threat from bullets fired by neighbouring Arabs.

At dawn the settlement was established. In addition to all the temporary amenities, including prefabricated houses, Haganah put up a network of fortifications to protect the settlement.

Synagogue Offerings for Emergency Fund.

During the first two days of Passover an excellent example to Peninsula Jewish communities was set by members of the Vredehoek Hebrew Congregation. With the approval of the Executive, it was announced that all offerings made during the festival services would go towards the Emergency Fund for defence needs in Eretz Israel. On both days there was a most gratifying response and the Emergency Fund has benefited by a very substantial amount.

In the Wynberg Synagogue, before Musaph on the 2nd day of Pesach, Rev. Ch. Gordon addressed the congregation on the significance of the festival observances and their relation to contemporary Jewish history. He paid tribute to the heroic soldiers of the Jewish State and called on the congregation to render at least financial assistance to the Yishuv's war effort. In particular Rev. Gordon called for contributions to the Magen David Adom.

Following the appeal, members of the congregation were asked to come on to the Bimah and to make their pledges for this cause. Scenes of great enthusiasm followed and donations varying from five to one hundred guineas were pledged; in a short time nearly £500 was raised.

The eagerness and spontaneity which marked the occasion were quite unprecedented, and are worthy of emulation.
