Outstanding Musical Event.

JOINT RECITAL BY ESTHER SALAMAN AND PAUL HAMBURGER.

The joint recital given at the City Hall last Saturday night by Esther Salaman, mezzo-soprano, and Paul Hamburger, pianist, was an outstanding musical event.

Miss Salaman presented a programme of wide range and variety and revealed herself as a consummate artist in her own particular sphere. She has a voice of fine quality and the gift of interpreting each song in such a way as to convey its very essence to her audience, whom she wins over immediately she makes her first appearance on the stage by her charming and vivacious personality.

The first part of the programme consisted of early French, Italian and English songs; the most impressive of these were Plaisir d'amour (Martini); Liber Scriptus Proferetur (Verdi) and a Hymn to God the Father (Pelham Humphrey).

After the interval she sang a group of lieder by Schubert and Brahms, as well as a number of folksongs from different countries—Palestine, England, Ireland, Nova Scotia, France and several negro spirituals. Each of these, varied as they were, was exquisitely rendered and evoked enthusiastic applause. Her singing of the Hebrew "Havah Nagilah" was a revelation and as an encore she gave a beautiful little song in Yiddish. "Como La Rosa," sung in Ladino (old Spanish with a touch of Hebrew) was also a sheer delight.

Miss Salaman received a great ovation at the close of her recital and generously gave several encores.

Paul Hamburger proved himself a most sympathetic accompanist throughout. He also gave an excellent performance of Beethoven's Waldstein Sonata and as an encore a waltz by Poulenc.

On Sunday evening, 16th May, Malmesbury was privileged to hear Mrs. Mary Segal, of Cape Town, talk on Palestine and the invaluable work of the Wizo. Mrs. Segal was accompanied by Mrs. Pearl Rubin and Mrs. Wolman, also of Cape Town.

Mrs. Segal's speech was very enlightening and she laid stress on the fact that the present generation of Jews should consider themselves the privileged generation that in their lifetime the State of Israel was proclaimed. Questions by various members of the audience were answered readily and in full detail by Mrs. Segal.

Refreshments were served by Mrs. Julius Roer at her residence and all Jews of Malmesbury are appreciative of the visit of the three ladies from Cape Town.
