## Late Mr. Elijah Korff.

At the annual general meeting of the Muizenberg Talmudical Study Society the chairman, Mr. B. P. Phillips, referred to the great loss they had sustained in the death of Elijah Korff, the vice-chairman of the society.

Not only had the society lost a very active member who took a great interest in the affairs of the society, but the Muizenberg community mourned the loss of a true son of Israel, orthodox in his belief and a great lover of the Torah and of his nation.

The late Mr. Korff was born in Pilken (Kurland) 71 years ago and came to South Africa as a youth before the Boer War. He established himself at first in the Orange Free State and later on he opened a tobacco factory in Johannesburg. During his stay there he took an active part in communal life, especially in the Jewish charitable institutions, but owing to ill health he had to retire to Muizenberg, where he interested himself in everything Jewish, especially the Mizrahi movement. His brother, Rabbi Chaim Korb, is an outstanding figure in the rabbinical world, being the rector of a great Talmudical college in Chicago and the author of many well-known rabbinical works.

His sister, Mrs. Kritz, kept house for him for many years, and sympathy is extended to her in her bereavement.

After providing for his nearest relatives Mr. Korff left the bulk of his fortune towards the formation of a Yeshivah in Israel, as well as for other institutions. He was a brilliant raconteur, well travelled and endowed with an exceptional memory; many of his Muizenberg friends will feel the gap he has left in their midst.
