Owing to the Treasurer's absence overseas, the Hon. Secretary, Mr. A. Simson, gave the financial report and at the same time acquainted the mem-

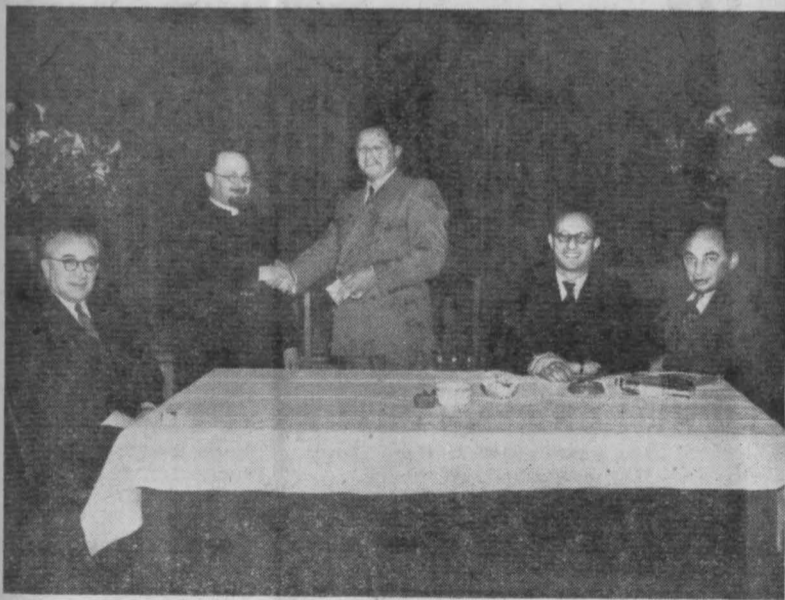
bers present with the more important tasks which lie ahead after the forthcoming Annual General Meeting, which is to take place some time in November.
