Ballet at the Alhambra.

Booking is now open for a week's season of ballet at the Alhambra from Monday, 15th November. Two programmes will be presented during this season, the first from Monday to Wednesday, and the second from Thursday to Saturday. The ballets will be staged by the University of Cape Town Ballet Company, director Dulcie Howes, and by the Johannesburg "Ballet Theatre" company, directors Arnold Dover and Stanley Hockman.

11th Annual Torah Va-Avodah Camp.
