Visit of Famous Pianiste

Pnina Saltzman's Brilliant Career



MUSIC lovers are eagerly looking M USIC lovers are eagerly looking forward to the visit of Pnina Saltzman, the brilliant 20-year-old Palestinian pianiste, who is to undertake a concert tour of the Union under the auspices of the Cherniavsky Bureau. She will make her debut in the City Hall, Johannesburg, on Monday, February 7, and will give further performances on February 11 and 16.

Born in Tel-Aviv, Miss Saltzman was "discovered" by the famous pianist Alfred Cortot while he was visiting Palestine in 1932. He persuaded her to go to Paris where she entered the "Ecole Normale de Musique," under the direction of Mr. Cortot. She made brilliant progress, and in 1938 obtained the "Premier Prix de Piano,"

Miss Saltzman appeared in Paris with the Colonne Orchestra and gave many recitals in various countries. The wonderful tonal quality of her playing and her gift of interpretation won for her golden opinions.

In 1939 she returned to Palestine, where she has many times appeared with the world famous Palestine Symphony Orchestra. She recently accompanied the orchestra on its Egyptian tour and gained many new admirers, including General Sir Henry Maitland Wilson, Supreme Commander-in-Chief of the Mediterranean, who attended several of the concerts.
