African Music.

The Progressive Music Society provided a very instructive and entertaining evening last Wednesday at the Left Club in the form of a lecture by Mr. Hugh Tracey, of Durban, on African music. Mr. Tracey confined his talk to a small group of Bantu musicians. of the Bachopi tribe living in Portuguese East Africa.

Portuguese East Africa.

The African orchestras play on an instrument resembling a wooden xylophone. The musicians give recitals twice a week, and they compose elaborate orchestral dances almost every year. The compositions consist of about 11 movements, each based on some special theme, which is sung and danced by the tribesmen. The recitals have a definite social and moral value, as the themes are often satiric comments on the failings of the chiefs and of individual members of the community. These musical performances, therefore, become an intrinsic part of tribal life, and Mr. Tracey stressed the importance of encouraging the development of traditional African music and poetry. Mr. Tracey then illustrated his address with unique gramophone records.


