## "Women in the Services in Palestine"

## Rabbi Dr. Rabinowitz Addresses W.Z.L.

ONE of the largest gatherings ever to fill the Coronation Hall at a meeting of the Johannesburg Women's Zionist League listened with rapt attention to Rabbi Dr. L. Rabinowitz, the new Chief Minister of the United Hebrew Congregation and newly-appointed Professor of Hebrew at the University of the Witwatersrand, when he spoke last Monday afternoon on "Women in the Services in Palestine."

in Palestine."

"The A.T.S. of the Middle East," said Rabbi Rabinowitz, "is beyond doubt and question overwhelmingly the contribution of Palestinian Jewish women to the war effort. No other women of the Middle East took part or came forward." The authorities had refused to allow the service to be called P.A.T.S. as too much favouring the Palestine women, but when he had been a "glad witness" of the first "church" parade of the women in uniform and when the officer called upon those not of Jewish faith to step forward, one solitary Arab girl had fallen out. He had heard, said the speaker, that even this recruit asked to be released three days later, declaring that she had joined only because a representative of the British Government had begged her parents to let her join so that the A.T.S. should not be a completely Jewish show.

Constant Pinpricks

In spite of the glowing opinions the women had won for their loyalty and work, there were constant pinpricks to their Jewish honour. On the occasion of a King's Birthday parade, when six Cypriot girls, four Greek girls and a Maltese girl carried flags representing their countries, the

fifteen hundred Palestinian women who marched were not allowed to carry their flag. "The excuse made was that Jews were not a nation and therefore did not have a national flag."

Women who had previously had no religious upbringing insisted after the first compulsory service on celebrating the Sabbath wherever they were. In Cairo and Alexandria, the Palestinian A.T.S. worked with the Jewish soldiers in those cultural activities which became a feature of "Tarbuth" committees

#### A Memorable Service

His last service for an A.T.S. Unit was held in the desert on T'isha B'av. It was one of the most memorable occasions of a memorable part of his activities. News had been received of the ruthless policy of extermination of Jews in Europe, and every one of the girls had relatives in occupied countries.

countries.

"The 2,000 Jewesses in the A.T.S. were a brand plucked from the burning. You Jewesses in South Africa, the glorious opportunity of service was not yours to give, but you stand half way. It is for you to determine whether you will be a force for survival of the Jewish people. The example of the Palestinian women is an inspiration and lesson to every Jewish woman to-day," concluded Rabbi Rabinowitz.


