#### MESSRS. KENTRIDGE, M.P., AND OVEDOFF ADDRESS **GREENSIDE JEWRY**

On Sunday, July 15, Mr. Morris Kentridge, M.P., and Mr. A. Ovedoff addressed members of the Parkview and Greenside communities on "The Position of Jewry in South Africa." Mr. Max Goodman, Chairman of the local Congregation, presided.

Dealing with the South African scene, Mr. Kentridge said that the Board of Deputies was working to safeguard the rights of the Jews. It endeavoured to obtain for our people "a fair field and no favours." The last Parliamentary session had witnessed a diminution of attacks on the Jews, and the Opposition had actually invited co-operation between the various sections. Many people, including Jews, had jumped to the conclusion that the Nationalists had shed their racialistic ideas, but their actual intention was a call for co-operation against the Africans. Such co-operation based as it was upon racial discrimination must ultimately make the position of all free citizens in this country completely insecure. A Government in which the O.B's and the Pirowites would "co-operate" could hardly be inviting to the citizen of a free and democratic country.

Mr. Ovedoff gave a brief resume of the problems discussed at the recent Congress of the Jewish Board of Deputies and also dealt with the manifold activities of the Poard. He appealed to all Jews, regardless of their political convictions, to take a keener and more active interest in the affairs of the community as well as in the work of the Board. The fight against Nazi influences, he said, should provide an effective platform for all Jews to unite.

The keen interest shown by the audience was indicated by the many questions put to the speakers.
