**LIEUT.-COL. ZWANEOEL
THANKED FOR GIFT OF
MENORAH TO GERMISTON
SYNAGOGUE**

**Admiration For Yishuv's
Achievements**

WARM admiration for the Jewish people and for their achievements in Palestine was voiced by Lieut.-Col. W. A. Zwanepoel, who recently returned from "Up North," when he addressed a gathering of the Germiston Jewry at the home of Dr. and Mrs. A. Litchtigfeld.

While in Palestine Col. Zwanepoel had purchased a beautiful Menorah, which he presented to the Germiston Synagogue as a token of his appreciation of the many kindnesses shown to his family by the Jewish community of Germiston.

Mr. L. Hosiosky, a member of the Council of the United Hebrew Institutions of Germiston, expressed the community's gratitude to Col. and Mrs. Zwanepoel (who was also present) for their very fine gift.

Mr. B. N. Cohen, J.P., Hon. Life President of the United Hebrew Institutions of Germiston, presided, and he and the Rev. Dr. Litchtigfeld welcomed the guests.

Impressions of Palestine

Speaking of his last visit to Palestine, Col. Zwanepoel said that he found the Jews friendly, keen, co-operative, and above all, confident that the establishment of a Jewish National Home would be effected when the evil of Nazism was removed. This atmosphere of confidence seemed to have imbued the Jews with renewed spirit, a desire to show the world what they are capable of.

He referred in appreciative terms to the spirit of goodwill and good fellowship the Jew displayed towards his neighbour, and deplored the fact that this was not reciprocated in similar measure.

He also paid glowing tribute to the Jewish war effort, declaring, "I have no hesitation in saying that when the history of this great war, which has just ended, is written, there will be a special section on what Palestine and the Jews contributed, and I feel sure that it will astound the world."

In Italy, he said, he had met the Jewish Brigade, and they proved themselves "fighting men of the first calibre."

The vote of thanks proposed by Mr. H. Rosen was warmly applauded, and showed how deeply Col. Zwanepoel's address was appreciated by the gathering.

"Simchat Torah" Concert

THE Johannesburg Jewish Choral Society is presenting another of its "All-Jewish Music" concerts on Sunday, September 30, at the Selborne Hall.

On this occasion all the items will be of particular interest to lovers of Jewish melody, and in most cases they will receive their first performance on this sub-continent. The programme includes modern Palestinian songs and orchestral compositions by contemporary Jewish composers, such as Michael Lewin, J. Brandman, N. Wolpowitz, L. Lwow, A. E. Ellstein, J. Weinberg, A. M. Rothmuller, J. Idelson, M. Posner, and Ernest Bloch.

Jean Gluckman will sing Hebrew songs, Eugene Magid will contribute violin solos, and Jerry Idelson will conduct the choir and orchestra with Bram Verhoef as leader.
