SUCCESSFUL "OPHIR" EVENING

THE "Ophir" (Jewish Arts Association of S.A.) function held last Saturday night at the Carlton Hotel presented a departure from the usual meetings. Unlike in the past, the function, which was very well attended, was more in the nature of a social gathering than a literary evening. The major part of the programme was devoted to a talk by Dr. J. Sachs on an album of drawings illustrating Jewish life and literature by Aria Merzer, an artist from Paris now resident in Palestine. The book was published partly with the financial assistance of "Ophir," through its fund in aid of Jewish artists overseas. It was therefore of particular gratification to the association to see the first substantial results of its endeavours.

In reviewing the book, Dr. Sachs drew a parallel between the heritage of the French artists and their Jewish colleagues who hailed from the centres of Jewish life in Eastern Europe. He pointed out the various influences that were evident from the work of Aria Merzer.

Jayne Sussman, with Suzanne Margolis at the piano, delighted the audience with arias from "The Magic Flute" and "Madame Butterfly."

In his opening remarks the chairman, Mr. Gershter, reported on the activities of "Ophir" in sending regular food parcels overseas to Jewish artists. He also announced that the next function, on February 16, would be devoted to a reading of a recent poem by David Fram.
