It was indeed a pleasure to attend the fourth rehearsal of the newly-formed Jewish Youth Orchestra last Sunday morning.

Some forty youthful musicians from the age of 8 upwards, eagerly followed the baton of the youthful Musical Director and Conductor of the Jewish Musical Institute, Mr. Solly Aronowsky, the well-known violinist. They played various items with great gusto, including a latest Palestinian song and the Barcarofe from the Tales of Hoffman, by Offenbach. A most encouraging sign was the strong brass and woodwind section, which, as a rule, is very poorly represented in most amateur orchestras. The organisers have great plans and intend to increase the orchestra to a hundred players.

The Jewish Musical Institute, established recently through the efforts of Mr. S. Aronowsky and Mr. Z. Engel, also has a Jewish Children's Choir, which is under the combined direction of Mr. Ichilchik, the well - known Johannesburg choirmaster, and Mr. M. Tabatznik. The Institute also plans the establishment of dramatic and other sections, as well as the acquisition of suitable premises for a club house. The Administrator of the Institute is Mr. Z. Engel.

That the Institute takes its work seriously was proved during the rehearsal of the orchestra by the fine response from the Jewish musicallyminded youth. The Orchestra consists of school-children, University students, typists, nurses, tradesmen, mechanics, etc., and its repertoire will range from modern Palestinian songs and compositions by Jewish composers, to other popular music.

An enthusiastic admirer of this orchestra has extended an invitation to the Orchestra Committee to invite all orchestra members to spend free holidays on his farm.

Rehearsals take place on Sunday mornings from 10.30 to 12.15 at the Doornfontein Government School, Van Beek Street. All young Jewish musicians interested in the Orches-

## Parcels to Greece and Italy

The following regulations must be observed:

#### Greece

Only gifts of clothing and food-stuffs not liable to deterioration are permitted.

Worn clothing must be accompanied by a certificate of disinfec-

Only one parcel may be sent by the same sender to the same address per fortnight.

Parcels must be well packed and sealed (non adhesive 3 and despatch note must accompany the parcel). If the value exceeds £2 an Export Permit is needed.

### Italy

Only non commercial gift items such as food, clothing, medicinal and toilet articles not exceeding £6 in value permitted. If the value exceeds £2 an Export Permit is needed.

Tobacco and cigarette lighters are prohibited.

Not more than one parcel per month may be sent to the same addressee.

Measurements not to exceed 36 in. in length and girth combined (non adhesive 2 and despatch note must accompany the parcel).

Jacobowsky, a Polish-Jewish refugee, one of the many hundreds of persons fleeing before the Nazi advance, is in Paris. He buys a car, but cannot drive and enlists the aid of a reactionary Polish Colonel who agrees to drive the car, but first throws out the hapless refugees' possessions and substitutes his own. The subsequent adventures of these characters, Jacobowsky and the Colonel, form the basis of an entertaining and enjoyable story.
