

WELCOME TO NEW REFORM MINISTER

Arrival of Rabbi David Sherman

Rabbi David Sherman, who re-cently arrived from America to as-sume the ministry of the Cape Town Jewish Reform Congregation, was welcomed by leaders of the Reform movement in Johannesburg, at a reception held at the Carlton Hotel, last Sunday afternoon.

Among those present were Mr. M. J. Green, M.P.C., Deputy Mayor; Mr. B. A. Ettlinger, K.C., President of the S.A. Jewish Board of Depu-ties; Mr. L. E. Joseph, Vice-Presi-dent of the United Jewish Reform Congregation; Mr. V. H. Brasch, Hon. Secretary of the South African Union for Progressive Judaism; Mr. S. Redhill, Springs and District Jew-ish Reform Congregation; Mr. K. Stoloff, President of the Springs and District Jewish Reform Congrega-tion; Mrs. G. Trevor, Chairman of the Sisterhood of the United Jewish Reform Congregation, and Mr. B. Stalson, General Secretary of the United Jewish Reform Congrega-tion. tion.

Commenting on the growth of the Reform Movement in South Africa, Rabbi Sherman said he took it as an indication that South African Jewry was prepared for a liberal interpre-tation of Judaism.

Jews all over the world, he con-tinued, were beginning to ask to what extent the synagogue had been able to fulfil its proper function and pur-pose in preparing the Jewish youth for intelligent, informed and self-re-specting manhood and womenhood. It was through the glory of the ancient synagogue that the Jewish people were able to find in its ministration a certain sense of satisfaction and peace of mind which meant more to them than anything else in the world. them than anything else in the world.

was the purpose of the Reform It was the purpose of the Reform Movement to recapture something of that sense of the joy of Jewish living. That could be done only by making the message of Judaism meaningful to the Jewish youth in terms of their own experiences, by translating the traditions of the Torah, the ideals of the Prophets and the ethics of the Rabbis into terms of present-day re-alities.

DEATH OF ZIONIST PIONEER

Mr. Noah Wolman

The death occurred at Warmbaths, where he was on holiday, of Mr. Noah Wolman, a veteran Zionist worker of Cape Town.

Mr. Wolman had been actively as-sociated with Zionist work in Cape Town for over three decades and can truly be described as a Zionist pio-neer. He was a substantial contri-butor and investor in Paletinian enter-prises. He had close links with Eretz Israel and one of his sons is perma-nently resident there.

He held the position of president of the 1946 Western Province Keren Hayesod (in succession to the late Mr. Morris Alexander) and prior to recent ill-health had been an active member of several committees. He resided in Muizenberg for several years, where he was the chairman of the South Peninsula Zionist Asso-ciation. He was also a staunch wor-ker for the Hebrew University.

Mr. Moses Mark

The death occurred at Senekal on July 5, of Mr. Moses Mark.

July 5, of Mr. Moses Mark. Born in Russia 79 years ago he came to South Africa in 1892 and settled in Bloemfontein, where he was a well-known and respected citizen. Some 35 years ago he came to Sene-kal, and during his stay there took a very active part in all Jewish affairs. He was one of the founders of the Synagogue and due to his zeal and energy the necessary funds were collected for the building.

He was made a Life President of that institution as well as of the Zionist Society, on which bodies he at various times, occupied the posi-tion of Chairman, Vice-Chairman and ommittee member.

He is survived by his wife, his son, Mr. Abe Mark, and daughter, Mrs. Betty Mark Harris.
