HOUSING SCHEME FOR LITHUANIAN JEWS

The Federation of Lithuanian Jews in Johannesburg has received a cable from its sister organisation in Palestine informing it that the Tel Aviv Municipality is willing to allocate ground, free of all charges, for the erection of houses for Lithuanian arrivals from the concentration camps. A sum of £50,000 is required as South African Jewry's share in the scheme.

At a meeting of the Executive of the Federation of Lithuanian Jews, Mr. S. Stein, a leading member of the

Keidaner Society, stated that the Society has collected a sum of £10,000 for such a purpose and it now appeals to the other Societies and Lithuanian Jews in South Africa to make up the balance.

Mr. Kirson, a Johannesburg social worker, who has lately returned from a visit to Palestine, informed the meeting of his negotiations with the Ygud Iotzei Lita, and with the Mayor of Tel Aviv, Mr. Rokach, about this matter. He underlined the tremendous importance of the project.

YOUTH ALIYAH IN PORT ELIZABETH

The Port Elizabeth Youth Aliyah Campaign was launched at an enthusiastic reception, in honour of Dr. Nathan Morris and Mrs. Sadie Fredman, at the Hotel Elizabeth on Sunday night, March 16.

Mr. Nathan Melmed, who presided, warmly welcomed the delegation and promised that Port Elizabeth Jewry would wholeheartedly support this great humanitarian cause.

Dr. Morris, addressing the meeting, said that the devastated Jewish children, who remained in Europe, were fighting for their lives. They were languishing in D.P. camps—hunger and unhappiness written on their faces—but one hope—to get to Palestine as soon as possible and to start a new life. We must do everything in our power to see that their last hope was not dashed to the ground. These

children were bequeathed to the Jewish people of the world. When we realise the sacrifice that their parents and relations had made, then nothing we can do could be described as a sacrifice so far as these children were concerned.

Mrs. Sadie Fredman stated that only by devoting all their efforts to the rescue of these children would they receive respect and admiration from future generations.

The Rev. Levy proposed the vote of thanks.

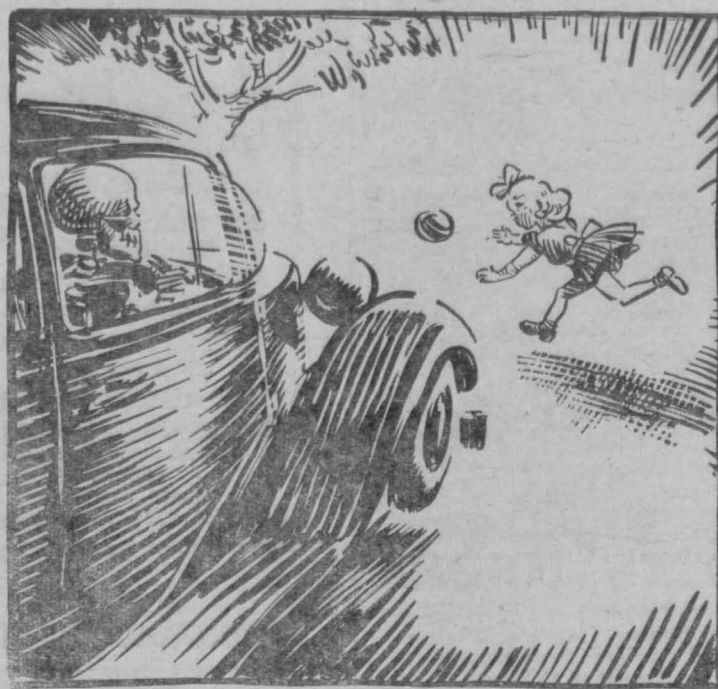
At the conclusion of the service at Temple Emeth, the Communal Seder will be conducted by Mr. I. Locketz.
