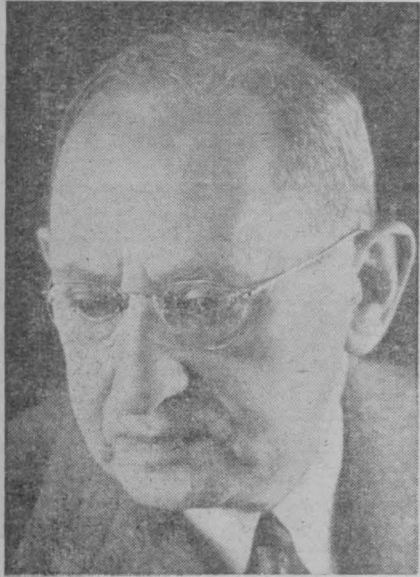


S.A. BOARD FOR INTER-TRADE RELATIONS WITH PALESTINE

The South African Board for Inter Trade Relations with Palestine, which was formed recently to further trade between South Africa and Palestine,

The Board is sponsoring the first Palestine Industrial Exhibition in South Africa, which will be held in Johannesburg early next month.

The exhibition is under the joint auspices of the Jewish Agency for Palestine and the South African Zionist Federation.

Mr. Herzl Zuckerman, the special representative of the Palestine Manufacturers' Association and of the Foreign Trade Institute of Palestine, is collaborating with the Board in the preparations for the holding of the exhibition.

Sir Leon, who will lead the delegation conducting the 1947 South African Hebrew University Campaign, will leave the following day for Cape Town, where the Campaign will be inaugurated at a dinner to be held on Monday, October 20.

Of the other members of the delegation, Miss Marcia Gitlin will leave for Cape Town on Sunday, October 12, and Mr. Norman Lourie is expected to arrive from Palestine within the next week or two.

In Johannesburg

In Johannesburg the death of Mr. Myer Leibowitz, the able and devoted chairman of the S.A. Friends of the Hebrew University, has dealt a severe blow to the cause of the University. The members of the committee of the Friends are determined to proceed with their work for the campaign in the spirit in which Mr. Leibowitz would have approached it, and they have set their hands to the task ahead of them with vigour and enthusiasm.

The campaign in Johannesburg will be inaugurated at a dinner to be held on November 5. Mr. Louis Marks has accepted the chairmanship of the campaign committee and the Hon. Mr. Justice L. Greenberg is Hon. President of the campaign with Mr. Harry Lourie and Mr. S. Schneider as Hon. Vice-Presidents. The Vice-Chairman and Hon. Treasurer are respectively Mr. S. Kessel and Mr. P. Crane.

CHAZANUTH AT ITS BEST

Cantor Kusevitsky at Parkview-Greenside Synagogue

CANTOR SIMCHA KUSEVITSKY, who came from London to officiate at the Parkview-Greenside Synagogue, combines an excellent voice with expert knowledge of liturgical interpretation. The tendency to convert the service into a mixture of compositions drawn from different sources and painfully unrelated is altogether absent in Kusevitsky's singing. He has style and from beginning to end his service is one harmonious composition. The diction is perfect and his lyrical tenor has a mellowness which strains neither the singer nor the worshipper. There is no over-emphasis in his prayer, with the exception, perhaps, of the truah motif—which trembling sound of the shofar—which in vocal form has been made famous by Leibel Glancz.

Cantor Kusevitsky's voice is so good and so melodious that he ought not to resort to it too often. His "smooth singing" is a delight to the ear and moves the hearts of his congregation. His rendering of the Geshem prayer will long be remembered by his congregation. It was rich in quality, warm in tone and full of traditional praying which is the backbone of chazanuth. His "hashivenu" and "Melech Rachmon" are examples of the right traditional approach to the liturgy. The overall impression is that of an outstanding musical personality, with a warm Jewish heart, expressed through a beautiful voice and excellent diction. There is no doubt that he represents chazanuth at its best.

To Appear at Concert

Cantor Kusevitsky has had considerable experience as a concert singer. His greatest success was achieved when he appeared at the Albert Hall in 1945 on the same programme with Eva Turner, Frank Titerton and the B.B.C. choir and orchestra.

The public will therefore look forward to hearing him at a concert which is being arranged by the Magen David Adom, and will be held at the 20th Century Theatre on Sunday, October 19. Other artists to appear with him at the concert are Hedy Haas, well-known character artiste and impersonator, Faivel Zygielbaum, the well-known dramatist, Jerry Idelson, who has written a special arrangement of Jewish folk music for this concert, the Hazamir vocal quartet, and Idelson's trio.
